


St. James Parish ~ Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin

July 18, 2021



Apostle James the Greater (Older) was a Galilean, born about 3 AD near the Sea of Galilee, 75 miles north of Jerusalem. He was the older brother of John, the Beloved Disciple and Evangelist. These two sons of Zebedee were fishermen with their father. Jesus approached Peter and his brother Andrew and the two sons of Zebedee at the lakeshore calling the four of them as his first disciples, later called apostles.

The trio of Peter, James and John were Christ's inner circle. These who were called first, witnessed the transfiguration and the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. James and John stood out by petitioning Jesus for special places next to him greatly upsetting the other ten.

After Pentecost, James was regarded as the Christian leader, like a bishop, in Jerusalem and surrounding area. Soon James embarked on a long missionary journey to northwestern Iberia (Spain and Portugal). Some years later, he returned to Jerusalem where he was beheaded by King Herod Agrippa in 44 AD. His body was returned by boat to modern day Santiago de Compostela. He is buried in the 8th century crypt. The 1211 Cathedral, standing over the crypt, is one of the world's three great pilgrimage shrines along with Rome and Jerusalem.

The Cathedral of Santiago (meaning "Saint James") **de Compostela** (meaning "certificate of pilgrimage completion") is reached by millions of the faithful yearly. Many walk hundreds of kilometers from all over Europe on marked trails by posts using scallop shells and yellow arrows. Learn by looking up **The Way of Saint James** ("Camino de Santiago") to see how vast the network is.



Surrounding the large and impressive Cathedral, many other buildings serve the pilgrims for prayer, reflection and rest. One very unusual feature is a large incense burner that hangs from the Cathedral's ceiling. It swings like a giant pendulum trailing billowing clouds of incense. Its effect is very hypnotic and really mystical. This "**botafumeiro**" weighs 130 pounds, is over five-feet high and swings in huge arcs at over 40 mph. These are the days of our pilgrimage of discipleship to the kingdom of God through Christ.

Now 179 years later, our community of Saint James in Menomonee Falls, far from the Galicia region in Spain, celebrates our patron. Since 1841, we have been inspired and guided by his powerful patronage. We celebrate his and our feast this weekend. Let us burn with zeal and dedication in service to Jesus and one another here and now.

Saint James, pray for us that we may be willing to leave everything to follow Jesus as you did. Help us to become special friends of Jesus as you were.

Something to Ponder . . .

We are human beings connected with our Supreme Being and we all need to remember:

- **What really matters**
- **Who really matters**

We need to find that place where we can rest & let go of all of the barnacles we accumulate.

Rest, Breathe, Seek, and Love.

There's an ordinary pine grove located on a tree farm not too far from town where life's stresses and demands seem to melt away. It is here that all that seemed so important out there no longer is and one can get lost in the rows of trees and majestic beauty. God is here and all is good. We need to connect with the Divine Source of all that is in order to understand what it is we are doing and why we are doing it. Otherwise, things stop making sense and bitterness can overcome one's spirit. It's okay to play once in a while and to discover that place of profound life and peace. People always have needs and there is constantly something to do. And while all of that is necessary and we are needed, there is also that inner solitude within that needs to be celebrated and released.

The world will need us again when we leave the pine grove. It will all be waiting for us, beckoning for our attention. But we will have prayed and will have marveled at the silence and the beauty of goodness. We can go back, ready, and eager to listen, to help, to heal, to cry, to embrace, and attend to all that is asked of us. But, having let go of the distractions in that deserted place we will have a renewed sense of purpose. We will know better Who it is we serve and what we are meant to do. It will all be clearer now that we have been Divinely touched and refreshed.

St. James' Weekly Tithes (Outreach)

Since the 1980's St. James has distributed a portion of its weekly income as a tithe for various outreach programs and organizations. We will be tithing 2% of our monthly Stewardship + Offertory which in **JUNE** came to **\$779.13 & 779.13** to be donated to each of the following:

Casa Romero Renewal Center—Milwaukee—Inner city retreat center serving urban poor, especially the largely Hispanic South side population.

Family Missions Company for Matt & Katie Glafcke—Support for our lay missionary family from St. James so they may continue to serve as evangelists and servants to the poor around the world.

Parish Trustee

One of the blessings in our parish has been the continued support and willingness of parishioners to serve as parish trustees. The archdiocese requires parishes to hold elections every two years. Trustees serve two-year terms but there is no limit on the number of terms they may serve. Trustees are also ex-officio members of the Pastoral Council.

Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics, and at least 25 years old. Interested parishioners may place their name on the ballot by securing 10 signatures from registered parishioners. This year's nomination process will be electronic. For more information or for a nomination form, email Pastoral Council Chair, Terry Brecklin at: tbrecklin@gmail.com.

As allowed by the archdiocese, the Parish Director may select one nominee. If there is more than one nominee, elections will take place the weekend of August 14 and 15, 2021. If there is only one nominee, nominations are closed, and the nominee is declared elected to the position.

All nomination forms must be received via email by 12:00 Noon on Wednesday, July 29, 2020.
