Called to Be a Catechist...

Hello--my name is Tara Kane and I am looking forward to starting my 6th year of being a Catechist. I am a working Mom who, between carpools, dance and Girl Scouts, has had the privilege of teaching both of my daughters, at some point, during the past years.

I had always wanted to serve but was incredibly hesitant as I never knew what my calling was, until God sent us our youngest. While in her 4K CF class, an ask went out to parents to help fill in for a few classes here and there during the school year. My youngest did NOT hesitate in volunteering me! At first I doubted my decision, however, I wasn't in my first class for more than 5 minutes before realizing that was EXACTLY what I wanted to do. By the next school year I had my own class and I've never looked back.

Over the years I have taught 3rd, 4th and 5th grade classes. It never fails, every year I am astounded by how the kids perceive Christ and his lightthere have been several times when they have helped me re-think the way I view my life and current situations. I absolutely love watching their faith grow and love hearing them question their actions and the actions around them -- it amazes me what we can all learn from one another! I also absolutely enjoy sharing my stories with them--I'm not perfect by any means and I think they like hearing that I too sometimes make poor decisions, especially decisions that I regret afterwards. The thing I am most proud of, however, is seeing how my simple action of being a Catechist has impacted my own family: as soon as my oldest daughter started 7th grade she asked if she could be a Catechist Aide. Last year I taught 3rd grade, my husband Aided me and my oldest Aided a 2nd grade class. Watching my family's faith grow is, hands down, the greatest journey we've been on yet (and if you know the Kane family, you know we go on a LOT of journeys together with our camper)!

When I first became a Catechist I was super nervous about content for the classes--here I was leading kiddos on their faith journey and I was really worried I wouldn't teach "the right" stuff. However, the Christian Formation team does an AMAZING job in preparing class material for you ahead of time. With an easy to follow outline and a lot of suggestions (some storytelling, some work sheet based, some craft based, etc) there are always plenty of activities to choose from to fill the hour -- in fact most classes there are a handful of activities we don't get to. I learned very quickly that preparing content would not be an issue at all!

I hope if you are like me and feel the desire to serve, but unsure what your calling is, that you try teaching. I think you may be pleasantly surprised what you can do for the kids and what the kids can do for you!
