

St. James and Good Shepherd Anti-Human Trafficking Ministry Misconception #3 - Strangers exploit most victims of human trafficking. Frequently, there is a misunderstanding that victims do not know their traffickers, and 2020 proved this is false. Usually, there is a common understanding that recruitment efforts (typically low) are from intimate partners, family members, or close friends. In 2020, there was a notable increase in recruitment relationships in all forms of trafficking where victims knew their traffickers. Reports show a 47% increase from 2019-2020, where a family member or caregiver recruited victims. In labor trafficking, 69% of victims were recruited by a current or potential employer and 15% by a family member.

#### Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

### <u>Lent 2023</u>

The 2023 Lenten season begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday on Feb. 22.

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason:

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent;
  - Catholics who have celebrated their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days they may eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
