



Two weeks ago, we kicked off the Love One Another Campaign at St. James. The goal of St. James is to raise \$1,446,516 in 5-year pledges. Here are the updated totals as of May 2, 2023: St. James has received 76 pledges totaling \$614,210 for 42% of our goal. 60% of the funds pledged and fulfilled with go toward establishing our financial security with a creation of an endowment fund, building and grounds updates addressing short and long term anticipated needs, and supplementing a line of credit to fund unforeseen emergency expenses. We will also make improvements to our audio sound system, install new parish signage, and enhance our outreach. Lastly, we will continue restoration on our 171-year-old chapel. The remaining funds will support vital Catholic ministries in southeastern Wisconsin. If we surpass our goal, we will receive an even greater percentage of the funds raised.

St James & Good Shepherd Anti-Human Trafficking Ministry

Q: Often we talk about the Franciscan Peacemakers. Who are they and what do they do?

A: Franciscan Peacemakers creates a pathway to healing for women who have been sexually exploited. They offer safe housing, meaningful employment and a healing network of support to women while advocating for an end to human sex trafficking.

Q: How does St. James and Good Shepherd support them?

A: Each last Friday of the month, our ministry and wonderful helpers throughout our 2 parishes, will provide lunches through the 'Sign-Up Genius' by making simple sandwiches or providing a 'go with'. Volunteers will assemble the bags with non-perishable healthy snacks, (putting sandwiches in a different bag for refrigeration) and a volunteer driver will take them to the Franciscan Peacemakers location. Franciscan Peacemakers has a 'Street' Ministry and since 1995, *Deacon Steve Przedpelski* visits an active prostitution site and offers simple lunches to the girls/ women and in return hopes to create a bond of trust to those he meets and offers to help them start a new life without prostitution and drug abuse.

Q: How do soaps, lotions & candles fit in?

A: In 2013, the Franciscan Peacemakers opened their social enterprise to provide a safe, healthy, supportive place to work while in turn learning new skills to help them in their new life!

Formerly known as Gifts for the Journey and now known as Peace & All Good, St. James/Good Shepherd has them visit our parishes 3 times a year to sell their products! Thank you for your past purchases and support!
